Moreover, combined with the latest WDR technology and low-light technology, the 5 MP Series is able to deliver high quality images in the dark, low light condition.

5 MP H.265 IR Rugged Dome Camera is designed to withstand ever-changing outdoor environment and is compliant with IP66 and IK10 standard. It is equipped with IR LED with an effective distance of up to 40 meters to ensure its usability under poor lighting condition. The camera operating temperature ranges from -55 °C to 55 °C.


**NOTE!** To use an external power supply, please contact the camera manufacturer to confirm that the power supply complies with the LPS requirements and shares the same power specifications with the camera.

**CAUTION!** Do not replace batteries of the camera. Risk of explosion may occur if the battery is replaced by an incorrect type.



## Connecting

This chapter contains the following information:

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## **Camera Cabling**

Before users connect cables, make sure that all cables and the power adapter are placed in dry and well-waterproofed environments, e.g. waterproof boxes. The purpose is to prevent moisture accumulation inside the camera and moisture penetration into cables, which might lead to device break-down. Please refer to the following sections for camera connection.

**NOTE!** This camera must be installed by qualified personnel and the installation should conform to all local codes.

## **Connect Power**

For power connection, refer to section Connectors, p. 10. Alternatively, users can power the camera by PoE if a Power Sourcing Equipment (PSE) switch is available. Refer to the section below for Ethernet cable connection.


**NOTE!** If the device is powered over Ethernet, make sure the PSE is connected to the network.

## **Connect Ethernet Cable**

To have best transmission quality, cable length shall not exceed 100 meters. Connect one end of the Ethernet Cable to the RJ-45 connector of the camera, and plug the other end of the cable to the network switch or PC.

**NOTE!** In some cases, Ethernet crossover cable might be needed when connecting the IP camera directly to PC.

• Check the status of the link indicator and activity indicator LEDs. If the LEDs are unlit, please check the LAN connection.



## Connect Alarm I/O

The camera supports one alarm input and one relay output for alarm application. Refer to section Connectors, p. 10 for pin definitions.

**NOTE!** Do **NOT** connect external power supply to the alarm I/O connector of the IP camera.

### **Camera Installation**

The following description demonstrates how to directly install the camera to the ceiling or to the wall.

Loosen the two security screws on the camera with the supplied security torx and open the dome cover.




2. Open the back conduit entry block using a coin and place it to the side conduit entry.



3. Place the camera at the installation location. Mark the position of the two screw holes and the back conduit entry (for cable entry use) indicated in the right figure on the ceiling or wall.

4. On the ceiling or wall, drill the cable entry hole (back conduit entry).





- 5. Drill a hole slightly smaller than the supplied plastic dowel on each marked screw hole. Then insert the plastic dowels into the drilled holes.
- 6. Thread the cables through the cable entry hole. Match the two screw holes on the camera with the plastic dowels at the installation location. Fasten the camera with the supplied self-tapping screws.
- 7. Attach the dome cover to the camera and fasten the two security screws.

## Access Camera

A client program will be automatically installed to the PC when connecting to the camera. Before logging in to the camera, ensure downloading the ActiveX control is allowed by either changing the ActiveX controls and plug-ins or setting Internet's security level to default.

#### ActiveX Controls and Plug-ins Settings

- 1. Start the Internet Explorer (IE).
- 2. Select **Tools** from the main menu of the browser. Then click on **Internet Options**.
- Click on the Security tab and select Internet, and click on Custom level to change ActiveX settings.
- Set "ActiveX controls and plug-ins" items to **Prompt** or **Enable**.

#### **Internet Security Level settings**

- 1. Start the Internet Explorer (IE).
- 2. Select **Tools** from the main menu of the browser. Then click on **Internet Options**.
- Click on the Security tab and select Internet.
- Down the page, click on **Default Level** and
   **OK** to confirm the setting. Close the browser window.

#### Camera Login

The default IP address of the camera is: 10.x.x.x. By default, the camera starts as DHCP client and automatically tries to get an IP address from a DHCP server.

- 1. Enter the camera's IP address in the URL bar of the web browser and hit "Enter".
- 2. Enter the default username (admin) and password (meinsm).


**NOTE!** ID and password are case sensitive.

**CAUTION!** It is strongly advised to change the default password. Refer to the menu tree of your 5 MP WDR IP camera for further details.

- 3. In the Viewer installation window, click on **Next** to start installation.
- 4. The status bar will show the installation progress. After the installation is completed, click on **Finish** to exit the installation process.
- 5. Click on **Finish** to close the Viewer installation page.

**NOTE!** Once the Viewer is successfully installed, the Home page of the IP camera will be displayed as the figure below.

#### **Zoom and Focus Adjustment**

The live image will be displayed on the Home page when the camera is successfully accessed. If zoom or focus is not at the desired position, please use the function buttons on the Home page to adjust zoom and focus.

#### **Setup Video Resolution**

The default values of video resolution are as below.

**5 MP** H.265/H.264- 2688 × 1512 (30/25 fps) + H.265/H.264- 800 × 600 (30/25 fps)

### **Configuration Files Export / Import**

To export / import configuration files, users can access the Maintenance page on the user-friendly browser-based configuration interface.

The Maintenance setting can be found under this path: **System> Maintenance**.

Users can export configuration files to a specified location and retrieve data by uploading an existing configuration file to the camera. This is especially convenient to make multiple cameras having the same configuration.

#### Export

Users can save the system settings by exporting the configuration file (.bin) to a specified location for future use.

- Click on the **Export** button, and the popup File Download window will come out.
- Click on **Save** and specify a desired location for saving the configuration file.

#### Upload

To upload a configuration file to the camera, click on **Browse** to select the configuration file, and then click on the **Upload** button for uploading.

## **Tech Support Information**

This chapter provides information on how to delete previously-installed Viewer in the PC and how to setup the Internet security.

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### **Delete the Existing Viewer**

For users who have installed the Viewer in the PC previously, please first remove the existing Viewer from the PC before accessing to the IP camera.

#### **Deleting the Viewer**

In the Windows **Start Menu**, activate **Control Panel**, and then double click on **Add or Remove Programs**. In the **Currently installed programs** list, select **Viewer** and click on the button **Remove** to uninstall the existing Viewer.

#### **Deleting Temporary Internet Files**

To improve browser performance, it is suggested to clean up all the files in the **Temporary Internet Files**. The procedure is as follows.

- 1. Click on the **Tools** tab on the menu bar and select **Internet Options**.
- 2. Click on the **Delete** button under **Browsing history** section.
- 3. In the appeared window, tick the box beside **Temporary Internet files** and click on **Delete** to start deleting the files.

## **Setup Internet Security**

If ActiveX control installation is blocked, please either set Internet security level to default or change ActiveX controls and plug-ins settings.

Internet Security Level: Default

- 1. Start the Internet Explorer (IE).
- 2. Click on the **Tools** tab on the menu bar and select **Internet Options**.
- 3. Click on the **Security** tab, and select **Internet** zone.
- 4. Down the page, click on the **Default Level** button and click on **OK** to confirm the setting. Close the browser window, and restart a new one later to access the IP camera.

#### ActiveX Controls and Plug-ins Settings

- 1. Repeat **Step 1 to Step 3** of the previous section above.
- 2. Down the page, click on the **Custom Level** button to change ActiveX controls and plug-ins settings. The Security Settings window will pop up.
- 3. Under ActiveX controls and plug-ins, set ALL items listed below to Enable or Prompt:
  - Binary and script behaviors.
  - Download signed ActiveX controls.
  - Download unsigned ActiveX controls.
  - Allow previously unused ActiveX controls to run without prompt.
  - Allow Scriptlets.
  - Automatic prompting for ActiveX controls.
  - Initialize and script ActiveX controls not marked as safe for scripting.
  - Run ActiveX controls and plug-ins.
  - Only allow approved domains to use ActiveX without prompt.
  - Script ActiveX controls marked safe for scripting\*.
  - Display video and animation on a webpage that does not use external media player.

**NOTE!** These items may vary according to the IE version used.

- 4. Click on **OK** to accept the settings. A prompt window will appear for confirming the setting changes, click **Yes(Y)** to close the Security Setting window.
- 5. Click on **OK** to close the Internet Options screen.
- 6. Close the browser window, and restart a new one later to access the IP camera.



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
